The itinerary will include many sites important for the Ancient Unity, especially Prague (with worship in Bethlehem Chapel), Tabor, Kozi Hradek (the castle where Hus stayed during his exile), Pobebrady, Brandys, Litomyšl, Fulnek (where Comenius was pastor), Suchdol (home of David Nitschmann and other refugees), Uhersky Brod (Comenius Museum), and Herrnhut. The trip will also include time in Budapest, Vienna, and a cruise through the Wachau Valley. The trip is limited to 33 persons.
